A Revolution of Faith: part 2
“The Wrath of God”

This week’s Scripture focus: **Romans 1:18-32**

1. What part of the text or message had the greatest impact on you? Where were you most encouraged, intrigued, or challenged?
2. Read Romans 1:18. Explain this statement: *“Before we can fully understand God’s love, we’ve got to understand and come to terms with God’s wrath.”* Is God’s wrath only reserved for the Old Testament? Explain your answer.
3. If God’s wrath remains on whoever rejects His Son (John 3:36), what about the people who have never heard about Jesus or have never read a Bible? Read Romans 1:19-20. Why is no one without excuse?
4. Read Romans 1:21-23. Explain what idolatry is? Is it only reserved for worship of statues of people or animals? 1 John 5:21 (NLT) says, “Dear children, keep away from anything that might take God’s place in your hearts.” What are some modern-day examples of idols? What “idols” have you made in your own life?
5. Read Romans 1:24-32. Explain the passive wrath of God. What is it and how has it manifested itself in our world today? What does it mean when Paul says, “God gave them over”?
6. How is homosexuality viewed in our world today? According to this passage in Romans, how does God view homosexuality? As a Christian, what should our response be toward the homosexual community?
7. Read 1 Corinthians 6:9-11. What’s the bad news/good news? “And that is what some of you were.” What was your life like before Jesus and how did He make a difference?
8. Jesus was called “a friend of sinners” and was described as being “full of truth and grace”? Are you? How can we do a better job of being more and more like Jesus?
